What have you led, achieved or materially contributed early in your career? Please include relevant achievements such as projects, products, initiatives, research, advocacy, business outcomes, community contribution, team leadership, innovation, industry engagement, customer outcomes, policy work, education or other major contributions. (300 words max)

What impact has your leadership had on your organisation, industry, markets or Australia's digital economy? Please summarise the outcomes your work has helped deliver. This may include business growth, customer outcomes, industry progress, product adoption, community impact, education, improved access, productivity gains, policy influence, innovation, ecosystem development, team outcomes or other measurable results. (300 words max)

How have you demonstrated excellence, leadership and future potential?

Please describe what makes your leadership distinctive, including your initiative, judgement, integrity, creativity, resilience, influence, collaboration, values, industry reputation, ambition, future plans or ongoing contribution to Australia's digital economy. (200 words max)
